

The Camelot Center Re-homing Agreement

The following agreement states all re-homing, either adoption or purchase, requirements of The Camelot Center. Each statement must be initialed by the adopter/purchaser, whether it be an individual or organization, stating that they will follow all the requirements for each horse. By initialing by each line, the individual or organization agrees to the rehoming agreement.

1. _____ All potential adopters, individuals and/or organizations must complete a written contract which is an agreement between The Camelot Center and the adopter.
2. _____ The Camelot Center will not adopt to first time horse owners under any circumstances.
3. _____ Potential adopters must make a site visit to The Camelot Center to meet the horse and show that they have adequate knowledge of horses and their care.
4. _____ Potential adopters must live within an hour of The Camelot Center.
5. _____ The Camelot Center staff will conduct a site visit to the adopter's location of the horse.
6. _____ Potential adopters are recommended to do a short-term foster with the horse.
7. _____ Adopters are required to provide updates which may include vet records and/or photos for the life of the horse.
8. _____ The Camelot Center staff may make periodic visits to see the horse with either notice or unannounced visits.
9. _____ Any adopter in possession of a former Camelot Center horse as of the date of this agreement **cannot** sell the horse at auction for slaughter or allow the horse to be sold, transferred, released or be placed into possession of anyone that will cause or allow the horse to be sold at auction for slaughter.
10. _____ The adopted horse cannot be sold, adopted, transferred, auctioned, released, given away or be placed into the possession of another person under any circumstances.
11. _____ The adopter must notify The Camelot Center immediately and the horse must be returned to The Camelot Center should the adopter decide that they are no longer able, or no longer wishes, to care for the horses.
12. _____ There will be no fee from either the adopter or The Camelot Center for the return of the horse.
13. _____ All vet records, farrier records, vaccination records or any type of health record must be returned with the horse.
14. _____ The adopted horse may never be bred.

15. _____ If there is any breach of contract, the horse must be returned to The Camelot Center.

16. _____ The Camelot Center shall retain legal ownership of the horse for its lifetime.

17. _____ References will be required from the adopter's veterinarian and farrier. If the horse will be boarded on property other than the adopter's, references may be required from other people.

18. _____ There may be an adoption fee for the horse up to \$300.00. This may be waived if the adopter is known to The Camelot Center, such as a volunteer, staff or friend.

19. _____ The Camelot Center requires adopters to provide updates, such as photos, health records, veterinarian and farrier records for two years from the date of this agreement. The Camelot Center may extend this requirement for the time period that it decides.

By initialing and signing this agreement, the adopter or organization will uphold all terms of this agreement for the lifetime of the rehoming contract.
