## Equest Equine Rehoming Policy

- A. Horses which are no longer able to work in the program or are no longer appropriate for the program will be discharged as soon as possible after this is determined.
  - 1. Horses which are sound and able to be suitably ridden are sold or found a suitable home. Horses are marketed to volunteers, board members, or acquaintances of Equest as well as other venues, if approved by the Director of Program Quality and Development.
  - 2. Appropriate retirement homes are found for horses which require a less active lifestyle, due to age or soundness. To ensure the appreciation of the animal, Equest may ask a nominal fee. Such homes may include weekend ranches or companion horse of a volunteer, client, board member or acquaintance of Equest.
  - 3. Horses which are no long able to be ridden are rehomed only to a retirement home situation as a companion.
  - 4. All new homes will be thoroughly “vetted” and screened for appropriate care, shelter, fencing and general conditions, with either an inspection or strong recommendation from persons who we trust and the prospective new owner’s veterinarian.
    - a. Horses which are too unsound or unhealthy to lead a happy life in retirement are humanely euthanized.
- B. Horses whose donors have indicated a “right of first refusal” will be offered to be returned to the donor. If the donor is unable to accept the horse, another suitable home will be found appropriate to the horses’ condition.
- C. Courtesy communications will be made to all donors of horses to inform them of the new home their former horse will be relocated to.
